2. Brief description of the locality and situation

Hevlín is a village of 1 400 inhabitants, located in the South Moravian Region in the Czech Republic in rural area next to the Austrian borders.

The railway line Hrušovany nad Jevišovkou - Hevlín is 7 km long and it is single-track. It was built in 1870 by Austrian State Railways company as a part of in that time important railway line from Brno to Vienna. During the World War II the railway bridge over the border Dyje river was destroyed and in 1947 the traffic from Hevlín to Laa a. d. Thaya was stopped. In 2010 the whole personal railway traffic from Hrušovany nad Jevišovkou to Hevlín was stopped and trains were replaced by more effective bus 104 going from Brno via Hevlín to Austrian town Laa/Thaya.

The station building in Hevlín which is heritage protected is not used for train transport any more. Recently the municipality of Hevlín bought the railway and plan to revitalize the surroundings by bike paths and other tourist activities.
