

First results SME survey


From November 2017 until January 2018, SMEs were asked to participate in an online survey. The survey was structured to assess the SME needs in regard to KETs at local level. The goal was to understand the status of KET's awareness and its usage in SMEs, the visibility of RTO acting as KET service providers, to get information on cooperation experiences and to understand barriers and needs of SMEs.
