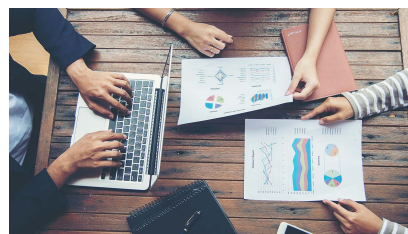
Interreg CENTRAL EUROPE 2021-2027: Looking ahead
